## First Ever Kinross Maintenance Olympics

An effective way to practice skills is through friendly competition. Add a traveling trophy and some bragging rights and you have a formula for fun. The first ever Kinross Maintenance Olympics was held on July 19 and 20 at Round Mountain Gold Corporation. The Maintenance Olympics featured teams from

four different Kinross sites: Paracatu, Bald Mountain, Fort Knox and Round Mountain.

The RMGC Truck Shop was where the Maintenance Olympics took place. Participants were tested in four areas: welding, CAT technical assessment, trouble-shooting on a D-10 dozer, and a fluid analysis test. Participants were chosen from each site based on their experience and how well-rounded they were as mechanics.



The contests took place over two days, July 19 and 20. In between contests, the participants were taken on excursions to Belmont and the Tonopah Mining Park to show them parts of Nevada's rich mining history.

When the contests were over, Round Mountain's Holden West-

wood walked away the overall winner. In second place was Trevor Bundy of Bald Mountain, followed by Ben Hull of Fort Knox and Fagner Silva Lima of Paracatu, who received the Judges Award. The participants received individual awards and the winner's site will host the Maintenance Olympics trophy for

the year. Next year a new Kinross site will be chosen to host the Olympics for a chance to crown a new winner.

The comprehensive contest proved to be a challenge for the competitors. This contest was meant to be a bit of a pressure test, said Kinross Nevada General Manager and Vice President Neil Jensen. "The welding challenge pushed everybody a little bit more," noted Neil. "Very few people can weld and fabricate extremely well and this part of the competition had both," he said. Neil mentioned the value

in gaining an appreciation for somebody else's core role and skillset and still know that a person can take the skills and apply them to move forward. At the Maintenance Olympics Awards Lunch Neil stressed the importance of finding the value in what a maintenance team does collectively to get a piece of equipment in good repair and get it back in service. That's what this Maintenance Olympics was all about.



The challenge of the welding and fabricating portion of the contest was echoed by all the participants. Holden Westwood of Round Mountain said this contest gave him an appreciation of what his colleagues do. "I don't know how those guys (welders) do it. My welding hood was fogged up and I used up every bit of the time," he told the others. This contest gave Holden an appreciation for what his colleagues do.


## **Meet the Competitors**






# 23-24 School Immunization Requirements

ATTENTION ALL 7TH GRADE AND SENIOR FAMILIES:

Immunizations are required before school starts on Tuesday, August 8. In order to comply with Nevada state regulations, 7th graders must have received a MCV4 (meningitis) and a Tdap booster for the prevention against whooping cough (pertussis). Seniors must have received their second MCV4 (meningitis) booster.

Once the student has received these required immunizations, please provide the school with an updated copy of the student's immunization record. If these are not received before the first day of school for the 23-24 school year, then the student cannot attend school until they can provide proof of their up to date immunizations.




