During the weekend of August 17-19, the RMGC's emergency response team took part in the 2023 Safety Olympiad in Winnemucca, NV, hosted by Nevada Gold Mines Turquoise Ridge. This is a change of venue as it has been historically hosted in Elko, NV.

According to veteran Olympiad competitor John Burton, the competition was as tough as ever. Thursday's content included a Fun Day, giving participants a chance to settle in. Then on Friday, Stations Day, the team had the opportunity to show-case their talents in the multiple stations: High Angle Rescue, Confined Space Rescue, Hazmat, Fire, Medical, and a written test station. Then Saturday was the main scenario which combined simultaneous rescue missions in a large-scale emergency situation.

New trainer David Reid and fire trainer Sheldon Self brought fresh perspective to this year's Olympiad preparations. "It was refreshing to have new trainers guiding the team," said ERT Coordinator John Burton. "We trained hard and came home with first place in the Fire station and third place overall in A-Flight," he continued. John noted that it's an achievement in and of itself to make it to A-Flight. Trainer David Reid added, "The effort was top notch and it showed," he said referring to the event placings. (Continue on page 3.)




