She has been in her role for a mere year and a half, but brings an enthusiasm and wealth of knowledge that you would expect from a seasoned professional.

The four core values are Putting People First, Outstanding Corporate Citizenship, High Performance Culture, and Rigorous Financial Discipline. Each year, Kinross chooses three employees in each category from across all of their properties who exemplify the meaning of the values.
