

Kinross Round Mountain Team Takes Mining Careers to LV

Kinross Round Mountain has been nothing short of impressed by the impact made on students by the Jobs for Nevada's Graduates, or J4NG, program. The J4NG program provides students with supports and mentors to create a pathway to the future. Not only do the students at Round Mountain High School benefit from J4NG, over 3,300 students around Nevada receive the services from J4NG to help them reach their full potential.

Kinross Round Mountain recognizes the potential for sharing the good news about mining careers with students who are exploring their career options. In November, the Kinross Round Mountain Team went to Las Vegas and spoke with over 400 students about careers in mining and the positive impacts mining has on our state. The team consisted of Nicole Silberschlag, RMGC Safety Su-


perintendent, Caleb Trease, Safety GF, and Sam Faga, RMGC Community Relations Specialist.

The RMGC team spoke with students not only about careers in mining, but the MTC (maintenance training cooperative) scholarship opportunities. Also included in the presentation was Assembly Bill 495, which was passed in 2021 after the mining industry pledged what could be as much as \$300 million into the state's education system.

The team was impressed by the eagerness and professionalism of the students and every classroom actively participated during the presentation. "Many students have already followed up with the RMGC team to get more information on how to start a career in mining," said Sam. The team will go back in early 2023 to meet with the rest of the high school students in Las Vegas.

One of the most impressive things that stood out to the team was how respectful the students were with the team's time and how grateful they were for the information. At Western High School, all of the J4NG students were dressed as if they were participating in interviews, Sam noted. In every classroom the students introduced themselves and shook the RMGC team's hands upon arrival. "Most of the students had no idea mining existed in the state of Nevada," Sam noted, which makes these visits even more important.

The team is looking forward to doing more outreach in Las Vegas, Reno, and the Elko area in 2023.




