According to Nicole, she has received very positive feedback. Comments like, This was the first time ever that I didn't feel like it was a waste of time, I'd come back tomorrow, and This was the BEST training I have ever attended were some of the responses the safety team received afterwards. "The employees' smiles and conversations at the site were all the proof we needed to know we hit the target," Nicole said.

Fitting over 850 employees into two weeks of trainings is a co-

ordinated effort of big things and little things. The credit for getting all the little things done goes to Cindy Sims, Safety Clerk. Cindy coordinated the scheduling, food, prizes, facility rental, training schedules and follow-ups on 5000-23s. She also makes sure every single employee makes it to one of the training days.

Speaking of the food, the safety team took on the task of prepping, making and serving the lunch this year. "We hand-pressed over 850 hamburgers, hand-cut over 200 pounds of potatoes to make French fries, and made a fresh set of toppings daily, including mushrooms, onions, green chiles, bacon, and eggs for our burger bar,"

said Nicole proudly. It seems the training attendees were very well fed.

In addition to the Cindy and the trainers, more people are to be thanked. Tim Chapman from Kinross Bald helped teach one of the classes. The Town of RM Recreation Center and the community gets a big thank you for allowing the safety team to leave up their scenarios for two weeks. It was also thanks in part to the Rec Center for the use of the facilities for the BBQ lunch.




