2022 RMGC Reflections

Greetings and Happy New Year! First, I would like to thank all of the employees for the effort put toward the many challenges we face as an industry, site, work team and community. 2022 brought high inflationary costs to our work and personal lives and reminds us to be a bit more utilitarian and get the most out of spending. We have brought in many new team members throughout the year and teaching the valuable mining skillset is of utmost importance to achieve our goals. We brought key topics into our work with elevated awareness for Pink October, Blue November, International Women's Day and International Miner's Day. We also completed key investments at the site. Mill Float Expansion came online, on schedule and well under budget thanks to a collaborative project team. The many months put into Cell B expansion of footprint and twenty foot raise of the embankment gives us operating capacity for several years. We focused \$53 million in spending on Phase W waste stripping to expose ore critical in 2023 production. We have reset our budget to current mining footprint, market costs, and operational statistics. Our key focus



is starting 2023 off with operational target achievement in Maintenance, Mine and Processing Departments.

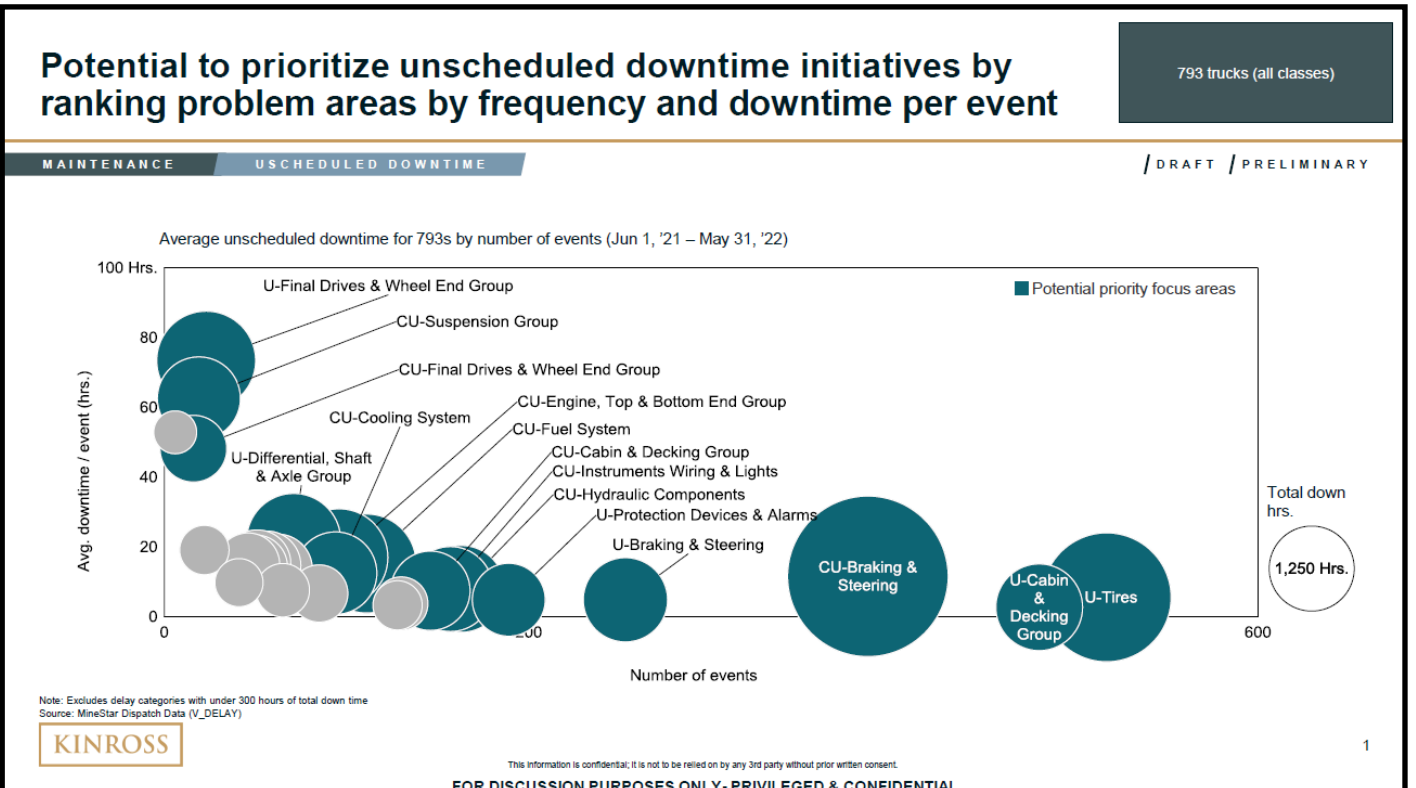
Let's check in with our departments.

Mine Department—Rusty O'dell, Mine Superintendent

We have done some great work over the 2022 year. We absolutely have made a positive impact on safety culture through looking at work execution differently using GAPS. A big win in 2022 was finding initiative ways to deploy technology using avoidance on blast hole drills and loading equipment to achieve mine plan designs. The Mining team performed some excellent project work around the site including work on the tailings dam, storm water drainage on the mine access road, and dozer work on increased high wall stability. Looking into 2023, the mining team will continue to focus on operational efficiencies, using operator excellences training, and the perfect shift matrix of 10.6 hours of productive time during a shift, this will ensure we utilize the haul truck fleet to 68% effective utilization.

Maintenance—David Gines, Maintenance Manager

From the mobile maintenance group, we are looking to achieve 89% physical availability of the 793 fleet. The slide below shows how we go about identifying where we need to improve our strategy, and focus. We look at the most common downtime drivers and the frequency in which we see these downtime events. The second slide (on page 3) shows the availability trend from July until December 29, 2022. (con't from page 2) Haul truck availability is the performance indicator that is driving our business going into the new year. We will continue to use this business driver until we can sustain 89% haul truck availability.

Ore Processing—Jarrett Kimmerly, Ore Processing Manager

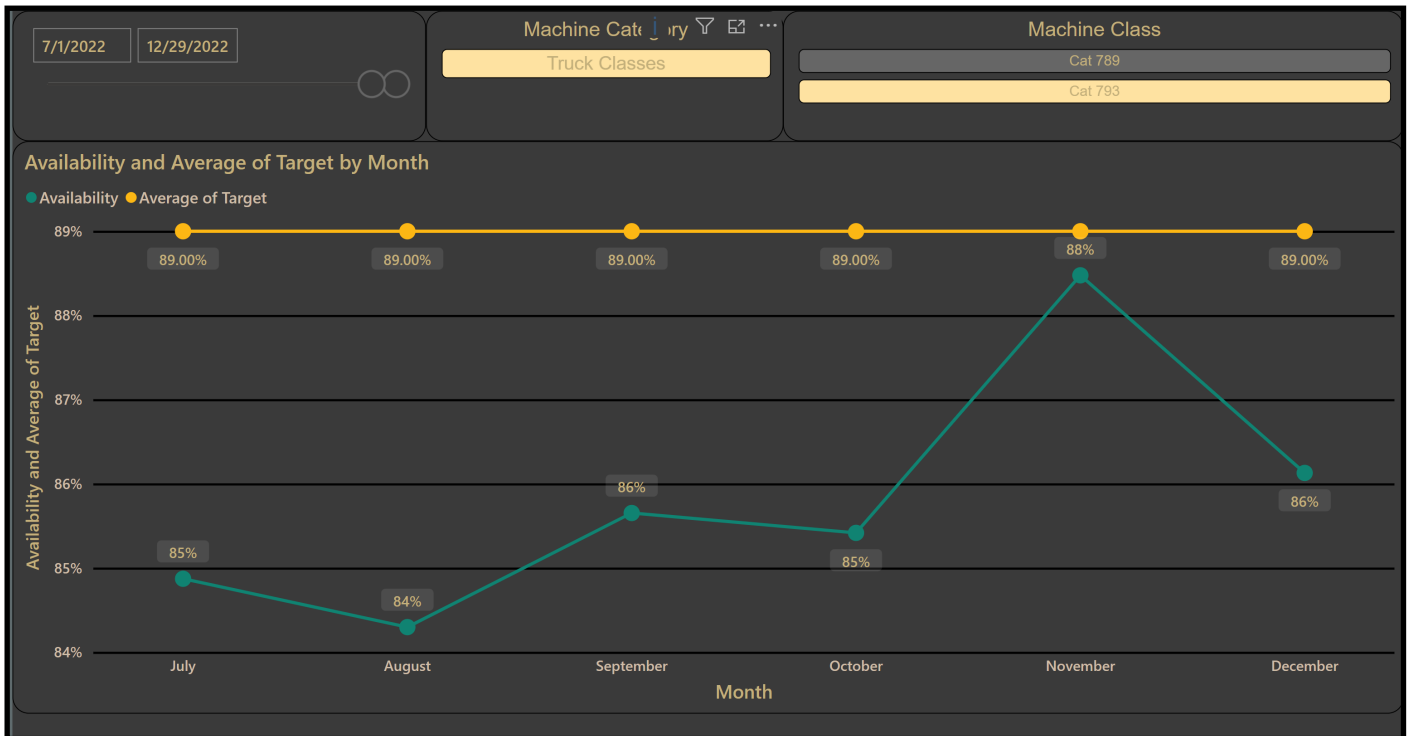
We finished 2022 with 226,000 ounces of gold equivalent production, which was just a little below our budget of 236,000 ounces. This is thanks to the whole site's hard work. Early in the year we responded to a serious incident and were able to implement controls to prevent it from happening again. Over the summer the Ore Processing, Mill, Crushing and Metallurgy teams were successfully combined into one department to improve efficiency. Numerous projects were completed including the construction of an inter-stage liner on West Dedicated leach pad and we greatly increased the number of solution wells installed. All three crushers increased production while the mill had an excellent year. The pad crew had a week with over 1 million square feet turned on. And a big thank you goes to maintenance for all of the support keeping our equipment running. All of that hard work will help set us up for a strong 2023 and beyond.

Operations—Don Weeks, Operations Manager

Looking back at 2022 each department had challenges put in front of them. The teams worked together on the RMSO project to evaluate what would enable the site to improve on our effi-

ciencies and drive harder to achieve our targets. The site also had significant inflationary pressures, which added more complexity to meeting targets. Despite all of the external pressures and opportunities for efficiency gains the site was still able to get close to the targets. This is was done with a lot of hard work by each and every employee doing their part. A huge thanks goes to everyone for all of their efforts in 2022. As we now move into 2023 we will continue to focus on the efficiencies in all of the departments through the RMSO efforts. RMGC must continue work as a Team—don't work in silos. If you see an opportunity in any element of your work or that of others, please inform someone about the opportunity. Thanks, all of you, for a good 2022, and I am looking forward to working with each of you in 2023 to make it a great year.

We have many things to be proud of and build on as we start the New Year. Safety performance is at the top of that list, no doubt! Thank you for all the effort and just plain hard work put into CRM and GAPS. We are doing better to recognize the risks of our work in the moment and dealing with them. We must continue to ask, "What is different today with my work that I need to deal with?" We are miners; safety is a key element of our work, production and skillset! Thank you to all the families supporting the workforce and community. Take the time to enjoy and celebrate with those around you. It takes everyone to make it work and I wish you all a great year.

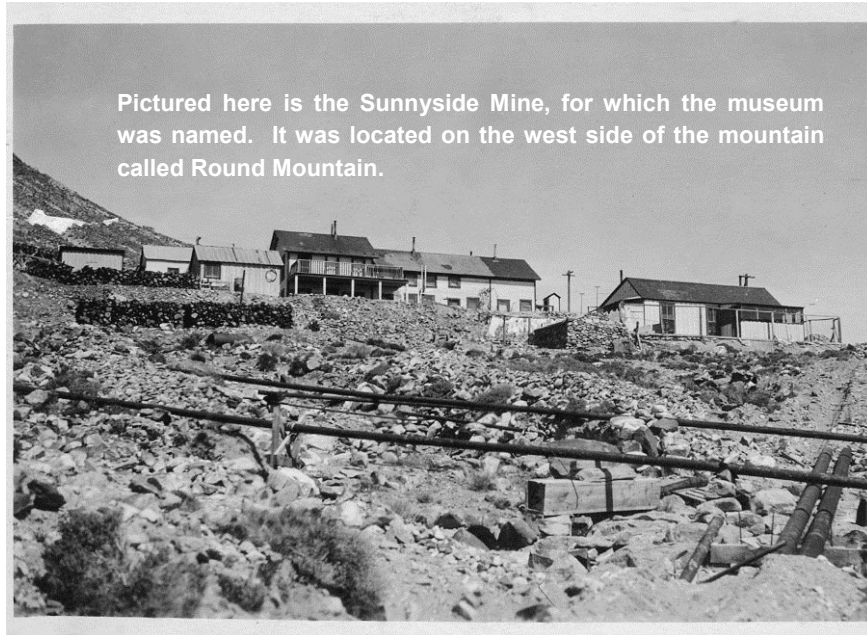
