Scholarship Recipients Get Ready to Head Back to School

Kinross Nevada prides itself on giving back to the communities it serves. One of the ways is providing opportunities for furthering education. Several qualified young men and women each spring are selected for scholarships. Up to five people are selected for the Maintenance Training Cooperative (MTC) Scholarship, offered through a cooperation between Kinross Nevada and Great Basin College. Another scholarship offered by Kinross Nevada is the Western Shoshone Scholarship, available to a member or descendent of the Western Shoshone Tribe. These scholarships offer the recipients a chance of a lifetime to pursue an education in their chosen fields.

The 2022 scholarship recipients have just finished their first semesters of study. The MTC programs are fast-paced 48 week programs in a skilled trade such as diesel mechanics, welding, or electrical systems. Adrian McLucas, pictured at top right, has had a great first semester. He was very excited to learn all that he has learned in such a short time. "We have covered hydraulics and basic vehicle electronics, but I have already learned so much in those two courses," said Adrian. "I had even learned things I have always been curious about all my life when it came to how hydraulics can be so powerful," he continued. Adrian went on to say that he has enjoyed all the hands-on labs where they built their own hydraulic and electric systems, learning all components of hydraulics and electronics. He is looking forward to what next semester brings. "One of the things I'm looking forward to the most is rebuilding an entire engine next semester and learning more about transmissions," Adrian noted. One of the benefits of being a MTC scholarship recipient is coming back to RMGC to work during the summer and winter breaks. "I returned to Round Mountain for the winter break and got to work in the truck shop and got to see the great friends I made during the summer in the PM shop," said Adrian. "I can't wait to return full time next summer!" he added.

Another MTC scholarship recipient, Nikolis Jung, also had a great first semester at GBC, pictured middle right. "Fall semester was pretty good," said Nikolis. He learned how to diagnose simple faults in electrical systems and how hydraulic systems work. "I look forward to doing transmissions and engines next semester," he said. Nikolas balanced a full home life with going to school. "I had a baby and got engaged during my first semester," said Nikolas. Like Adrian, Nikolas came back to RMGC to work for winter break.

Jordyn Foutt, right, the Western Shoshone Scholarship recipient, spent her first semester at University of Nevada, Reno and loved it. "The fall semester, honestly, was super difficult, but it was a lot of fun," Jordyn said. "I've learned so much about myself and met some really cool people. I feel like part of a community and I actually fit in, which is super amazing," she continued. Like many first year college students, Jordyn admits the first semester was harder than she anticipated and was a little stressful at first, but she feels confident (continued on page 3)

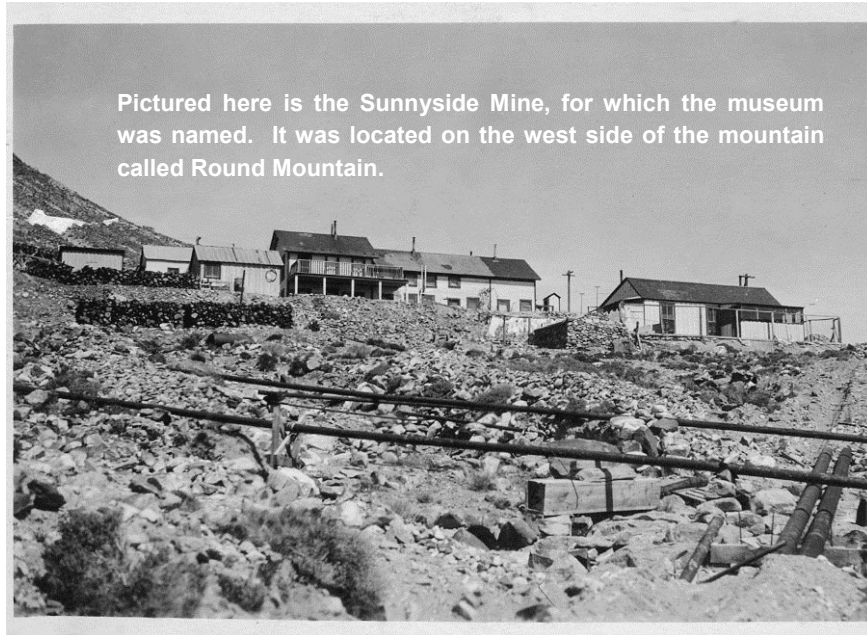

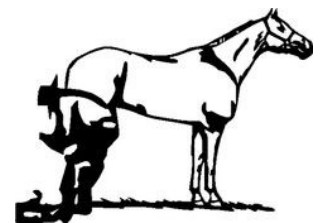
