J4NG and Kinross RM Enter Into 6th Year of Partnership

Neil Jensen, Vice President and General Manager of Kinross Nevada Operations, was invited to attend and speak at the state conference of Jobs for Nevada's Graduates (J4NG). Nevada's program is one of the top ranked in the nation. J4NG inspires, supports, and mentors students to create a powerful and positive future. Since 2017, RMGC and J4NG have been working together to create opportunities for the youth of this community and to help them to connect to successful pathways. RMGC currently sponsors the specialist at Round Mountain High School and provides additional funding and support on a monthly basis. The partnership has been powerful over the past 5 years with 100% positive outcome rate and 100% graduation rate.

While at the conference, Neil spoke to the attendees about the success of J4NG in Round Mountain. J4NG helps students plan for their future and provides support as they put their plans in motion. Neil described the challenges kids in Round Mountain face. "Students in Round Mountain have the benefit of having the single largest employer in Nye County five minutes from their front doors; however, geographically students are isolated and there are limited employment opportunities outside a career in mining," said Neil. He went on to add, "We at Kinross understand that our students need career development skills and feel fortunate to be in a position to provide the funding and support for the J4NG Round Mountain High School program." Neil shared that Kinross Round Mountain has been able to provide over \$200,000 in funding over the past five years.

During the past 2021-2022 school year, Kinross Round Mountain was able to send members of their team to speak with the J4NG students at Round Mountain High School. Guest speakers included drone operators, engineers, accountants, equipment operators, administrative assistants, mine trainers, occu-

pational health and safety personnel, diesel mechanics, welders, electricians and members of our management team. Neil said they also had the opportunity to host all of the J4NG students from Tonopah and Round Mountain programs at the mine.

There are many great examples of the partnership translating into real life success for local youth.

 Bayek Davis, 2021 graduate, went on to receive RMGC's Maintenance Training Cooperative scholarship for Great Basin Community College. He expressed that without the partnership of RMGC and J4NG he would not have had as clear of a direction on where to take his life after high school.

- Olivia Ortiz, 2021 graduate, attending University of California, Irvine, where she made the dean's list. She also works for a boba tea place close to school.
- Maxy Sarmiento, 2021 graduate, works as a full time employee at The General Store and is respected by her supervisor.
- Miles Sample, 2021 graduate, earned an associates degree at Great Basin College as a diesel mechanic. He works for Kinross this summer and is deciding whether to go back to earn his bachelors degree or go right to work.
- Emma Jane Gines, 2021 graduate, completed her first year at College of Southern Nevada. Emma is busy with work and nursing school.
- Moesha Tanimoto, 2022 graduate, plans to go to college either at TMCC or in Virginia where her father lives. She works for Kinross this summer at the Golf Course.
- Pritney Keju, 2022 graduate, plans to attend TMCC in Reno and works for Kinross this summer as a laborer.
- Giavanna Nelson, 2022 graduate, will head to Arizona in the fall to attend Aveda Institute in Phoenix to be an esthetician. She works for Kinross this summer as a laborer.

As the partnership between Kinross Round Mountain and J4NG continues into its 6th year, we are driven to provide local youth with all the opportunities for success.



July 4th Picnic Vow Renewal





QTrak Smart Locker System that will allow you to request library materials and have them available for you to pick upu 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. The process begins with a patron requesting materials by calling 775-377-2215 or emailing info@svld.net with the patron's request.





will either generate an email or a text message (whichever was chosen) that will send a special code for the patron to enter at the kiosk where the requested materials will be stored.

The materials will be available for seven days. If the materials are not retrieved within the seven day period, the materials will be removed from the lockers and checked back into the library.

To use QTrak, patrons must have an active library card and email or phone number for the system to send the code.

The lockers are located at the front doors of the Round Mountain Public Library.


