Andrew Mitchek Recognized for CRM Work

Critical Risk Management Project Highlight

As we continue to share our journey building and implementing our Critical Risk Management (CRM) programs, it is important we explain the "why" behind what we do. The goal for RMGC was to be innovative in preventing fatalities and mitigating critical risk scenarios. The team was never afraid of putting the hard work in—and trust us when we say there were countless hours spent and long days and nights working through all the different scenarios of risks that our miners could encounter. During 2020 our team did not slow down during COVID, they used that time to ramp up their efforts, to anticipate what we weren't expecting to happen and develop strategic plans on what we would do to eliminate those risks and scenarios from ever taking place.

With each new issue of the *Valley View* this summer, we would like to introduce key players of the CRM programs. This week we would like to introduce you to Andrew Mitchek, Dispatch Supervisor. Andrew played a huge role in our CRM programs, especially around creating avoidance boundaries and installing alarms on terrain machines. So what does that mean? We asked Andrew to explain to us the work he did and how he helped prevent critical risk scenarios from happening.

"It's a whole lot of nerd talk," says Andrew. "We set up buffers on grading and loading machines in the terrain server and uploaded them to the display. This creates a visible box on the machine and alerts the operator if they are getting close to boundaries or edges."

Andrew went on to explain that he and his colleagues created a design file in the machine that when the box comes into contact with the alarm it alerts the operator. He said they also installed speakers so it was an audible alarm and not just a visual.

"On the drills, it was a bit more complicated," said Andrew. There is a way to configure the drill to activate a function if it is going to drill into something in the design you want to avoid. So, with that knowledge and the help of their vendor they manipulated the display so it thought the drill steel was in the center of the tracks without manipulating the steel location for hole alignment. Then, since there is no size limit, they made the steel or boundary large enough to encompass the drill.

This function however does not alert the operator. It is a function in the DIM (drill interface module) that would provide a drill shut down, or other function for autonomy. Andrew continues, "I went to the drill with an electrical tester and a schematic while vendor Steve Rosato remoted into the display and manually manipulated the alert code (Switching input signal from 1 to 0 back and forth) while I tested different outputs on the DIM to find a signal change," When they found the wire, they spliced into it and ran it to a relay that powered a speaker. This now meant the operator would be alerted if they came close to a boundary or edge.

Andrew explained how they then trained those involved with

creating the proper alert boundaries.

Now Andrew and his team are looking at more ways to use it than just an alarm for the pit edge. For example, it could be used on loading units or using it for over dig locations like high wall cleanup.

Andrew pushed through the old thought process of *this is what we have always done*. When the technology was not there he created it—he didn't box himself in to what has been done in the past. He was innovative and creative and wasn't afraid of putting in the work, trial, and error to get results that keep our miners safe. It is worth noting that the work the RMGC CRM team and Andrew are doing is not only influencing our safety culture but also the entirety of the mining industry. We are leading the industry with the programs we are creating and the technology we are building in-house.




Kinross Supports Ronald McDonald House Charities
