

RMGC Clinic Nurse Jessica Kiburis Takes on New Role


RMGC Clinic is proud to announce that Jessica Kiburis is the clinic's new Family Nurse Practitioner. Jessica recently completed a Master of Science in Nursing becoming an Advanced Practice Registered Nurse and certified Family Nurse Practitioner. Having been in the nursing field for 19 years, Jessica loves serving as a nurse in our rural community. "My previous experience in emergent care set me up for the rural environment we live in," she said. Jessica is ready and eager to take on this new role at the RMGC Health Center.

Jessica's nursing began career in 2004 as a CNA, or certified nursing assistant. She then earned her LPN practical (licensed nurse) in 2006 and her RN (registered nurse) in 2008. She completed her Bachelor of Science in Nursing degree in 2019. She began her masters gram in 2021 and finished in April of 2023, the passed her National Board



Certification as a Family Nurse Practitioner in May 2023.

Jessica's passion for nursing began when she was a child. While Jessica always wanted to be a physician, nursing was a more feasible pathway after high school. But now she has the best of both worlds. "I get to care for people at a professional level with the autonomy to help people organize their health and wellness in an environment where healthcare is scarce," she said. Since she was 11 years old, Jessica has wanted to work in the field of medicine. "It's what I've always wanted to



do," she said. She never veered away from the medical field and has found it to be challenging, rewarding, and some days exhausting. "I truly care for people and want to find ways to engage the community in preventative care to minimize risk of disease and maintain a healthy lifestyle," she noted.

As a mom of two young daughters, Jessica knew going back to school while working a full time job would be a challenge. But with good organization and time management, she excelled through the program. "I woke up earlier and took every moment I had in the car to read or listen to lectures," Jessica said. "I also found and accepted help when I needed it," she added. If anyone is thinking about going into the nursing field, Jessica says, "Do it! Nursing is a very versatile career. It can be very hands-on or very hands-off depending on the role, but every



nursing role serves a purpose, which is very rewarding. You're never too old to learn something new."






4-H Grows Here!





23-24 School Immunization Requirements

ATTENTION ALL 7TH GRADE AND SENIOR FAMILIES:

Immunizations are required before school starts on Tuesday, August 8. In order to comply with Nevada state regulations, 7th graders must have received a MCV4 (meningitis) and a Tdap booster for the prevention against whooping cough (pertussis). Seniors must have received their second MCV4 (meningitis) booster.

Once the student has received these required immunizations, please provide the school with an updated copy of the student's immunization record. If these are not received before the first day of school for the 23-24 school year, then the student cannot attend school until they can provide proof of their up to date immunizations.

TRM Makes Improvements

Some big things have been happening in Hadley. A new Town Board that has been gaining momentum since August 2022 has made it a collective goal to do more for the community. Board members now include Chairman Nicole Silberschlag, Vice Chair Sara Sweeney, Clerk Vicki Richardson, Member Chris Philips, and Member Janet Jorgensen. This Board has been working hard to create a proactive town board who are committed to listen to what the needs of the community are and to do what they say they are going to do.

Chairman Nicole Silberschlag is excited to share a few of the projects that are in the works this summer. "The Town has worked very hard to make sure the pool opened this summer," said Nicole. In fact, the hours of the pool were extended this year and more lifeguards were hired. Eight high school students were hired as summer maintenance workers whose job will be to crack seal the roads on the south side of Hadley. "The roads on the southern side of Hadley are not in bad shape compared to the roads on the north side," Nicole said. She said the roads on the northern end of Hadley will be replaced in July. This \$1.7 million project will use the road fund money plus funds from the gas tax.

Other town projects are focused on improvements for kids. New clay was installed on the baseball and softball infields. A new t-ball field is under construction now and will be finished soon. A splash pad is in the works, but the Board is having trouble getting people to bid on it. According to Nicole, the project is still out for bid. "We want the Hadley residents to know we're committed to the children of the community," said Nicole. Currently, the Teen Center is getting a remodel into what will be called the Knight Klub, a pizza and arcade for local teens. "Teens will also be employed selling pizza after school," added Nicole.

The Town Board is looking to fill the Town Manager position. Currently, Nicole is acting as the interim manager until a new person is selected. "The Board is looking for a manager who is committed to being present and visible in the community, who wants to see change and improvement, and who is committed to the youth of our community," Nicole described. None of these improvements around Hadley would be possible without the help and dedication of the town's Board and employees. Sky Trease and Monika Larabee are the incredible duo behind all the Town's Recreation Department improvements and endeavors. Dennis Bunch and Sherman Richardson from the Town Maintenance Department have put in many extra hours with the clay project as well as the sod project at the t-ball field. And in the Town office are Heidi Bunch and Maci Curiel keeping the Town's administration running optimally.
