CRM Working at Heights/Loading and Offloading Team

At RMGC our Critical Risk Management program focuses on fatality prevention. Each team has an assigned risk topic with the end goal of putting critical controls in place to eliminate or reduce exposure. Our CRM teams have been challenged to identify tasks or jobs and rate them on the risk calculator. This allows the teams to focus on one individual scope at a time and come up with critical controls for each one as opposed to a one -size-fits-all approach. The critical controls are put into place to reduce the risk on each scope and are challenged several times a month by verifications done in the field. We challenge all of our team members to find and document failures, then we celebrate those findings. Celebrating failure is a different approach to our safety culture but finding failures in our critical controls prior to an incident is a positive outcome and makes the program stronger. Currently we have close to 30 teams that meet and focus on identified risks.

Since developing our CRM program we have made large strides in our ability to be proactive and recognize, assess and mitigate risk. A few examples of that are: Adding showers/eye wash stations outside of cyanide offload pad; Designing and implementing geo-fencing for dozers and drills; Fatigue evaluation; Prill silo relocation; Installation of fire suppression system on blasting equipment; Use of handrails on flatbed semi-truck trailers during offload at the warehouse.

Our CRM teams represent all areas of production, which allows

different perspectives and understandings of operational activities and potentials risks. Christina Jones is a lead and trainer at the Round Mountain Gold Warehouse and is a part of the CRM Working at Heights/Loading and Offloading Team. Christina's team was able to procure a safety handrail system which assists her team in keeping drivers and employees safe when it is necessary to get on the bed of a load. Christine and her team also began completing load inspection checklists in I-Auditor for every delivery. This helps keep her team accountable in the areas of energy isolation, load conditions and drivers entering the work area.

"Every driver chocks his or her vehicle, keys are placed in a lock box with a lock and drivers are to stay behind the chained off work area. We have many new signs explaining our procedures. While working with the CRM team, everyone was very cooperative and willing to participate with all the risk mitigation changes. My experience with CRM has been more than ful-filling! Being a part of change was inspiring. My warehouse team has embraced the change and has even my coworkers that are not on a CRM team have been thinking about ways to keep themselves and drivers safe. I am so grateful for the opportunity to be a part of something that keeps all my fellow coworkers safe and allows me to utilize and area expertise to reduce risk." ~Christina Jones.

Local Teen Qualifies for National Junior High Rodeo Finals





Leeah Osterhoudt is the older daughter of Randy and Elysia Osterhoudt. Leeah and her 16-year old horse Roany are in Georgia for the National Junior High Rodeo Finals. Leeah is a dedicated competitor who practices on cattle at least 4 days a week. Leeah said she was super excited to go to Nationals and she hopes she makes the short-go there. (Short-go is a term for the final go-round of the rodeo.) Leeah finished the season as the Nevada State Girls Breakaway Roping Champion. Even though Leeah was tickled at the mention of her recent championship, she is a humble young woman who stays focused by keeping her head clear of distractions and trying to remember to have fun. Leeah said she would like to thank her family and friends for supporting her and for donating towards her trip to Nationals.

The 2021-2022 Nevada State High School Rodeo Association rodeo season begins in August and ends in late May. During that time, 14 rodeos were held in all parts of the state. Contestants travel with their horses to host towns and compete for cash prizes, buckles, and points. Points are accumulated throughout the season and NSHSRA members are ranked. The rodeo events are bull riding, saddle bronc steer riding, bareback steer riding, team roping, girls and boys breakaway roping, tie down roping, chute dogging, barrel racing, pole bending, rifle shooting, and girls and boys goat tying. The top 4 individuals or teams in each event qualify for Nationals. This year, Nationals was 2,000 miles away in Perry, Georgia.

Although a resident of Smoky Valley, Leeah is a member of the Eureka Rodeo Team. She competed in several events all year. She was the state champion in girls breakaway roping, with a total of 189 points. She also qualified for Nationals in team roping with her partner Henry Buchanan from Eureka. Goat tying an ribbon roping were the other two events she competed in. Overall, Leeah placed 5th in the state out of 40 fellow girl competitors from around the state of Nevada.
