International Women's Day Celebration at RMGC

In the mining industry, women make up 8-12 percent of the global mining workforce. Women in mining work in a variety of roles, including labor intensive, technically skilled, and managerial positions. That is no different at Round Mountain Gold where women are an important part of the workforce.

While seeing women in various roles around the mine site is common in 2023, it wasn't always. Just over a hundred years ago, women were fighting for their place in the workforce. Since then, women all over the world celebrate International Women's Day.

International Women's Day is celebrated on March 8 each year. This is the day set aside to honor the social, economic,

cultural, and political achievements women. The foundation of International Women's Day began in 1908 as women workers in the needle trades marched through New York City to protest child labor. sweatshop working conditions, and demand women's suffrage, as seen at right. Beginning

in 1910, March 8 was noted and observed as International Women's Day (IWD).

Each year, attention is brought to some challenges women face in the workforce. A world free of bias, stereotypes, and discrimination is what's behind IWD. Celebrating women's achievements and raising awareness of the discrimination that still occurs takes a collaborative effort at any place of employment.

A BILL PROPOSING TO AMEND ROUND MOUNTAIN TOWN ORDINANCE 18, AN ORDINANCE CREATING WATER AND SEWER REGULATIONS FOR THE UN-INCORPORATED TOWN OF ROUND MOUNTAIN: PROVIDING FOR GENERAL PROVISIONS; PROVID-ING FOR APPLICATION FOR SERVICE; PROVIDING FOR NEW OR ADDITIONAL SERVICE CONNEC-TIONS; PROVIDING FOR WATER RATES AND REG-ULATIONS; PROVIDING FOR SEWER RATES AND REGULATIONS: PROVIDING FOR BILLINGS AND PAYMENTS; PROVIDING FOR DISCONTINUANCE AND RESTORATION OF SERVICE: PROVIDING FOR VIOLATIONS AND PENALTY OF VIOLATIONS; PROVIDING FOR THE CONSTITUTIONALITY, SEV-ERABILITY, REPEAL, AND EFFECTIVE DATE THEREOF; AND OTHER MATTERS PROPERLY RE-LATING THERETO; was proposed by the Round Mountain Town Board at its February 28, 2023 meeting.

A copy of the Bill is available for public review at the Round Mountain Town Hall located at 100 Hadley Circle, Round Mountain, Nevada.





Library Park Passes Available at RMPL

Library Park Pass Program offers a new way for Nevadans to "Check out their State Parks"

The <u>Nevada Division of State Parks</u> is excited to announce a new way for Nevadans to check out their State Parks – by borrowing a park pass from their local public library. The new Library Park Passes cover the day-use entrance fee for one passenger vehicle with up to eight people, and may be borrowed for one week, then returned to the library for others to check out. Each public library in Nevada has been provided with two passes that can be checked out by library patrons. This new program will provide more Nevadans with opportunities to discover their spectacular State Parks by removing barriers and creating more equitable access to nature.

"I thank Nevada's public libraries for supporting our efforts to provide outdoor access for all," said **Nevada State Parks Administrator Bob Mergell**. "By making libraries a gateway to State Parks, our goal is to help more Nevadans explore the outdoors, while creating healthier communities with stronger connections to Nevada's spectacular natural and cultural resources."

The new Library Parks Pass Program is a collaboration between Nevada State Parks and Nevada's system of public libraries and is funded by the Nevada State Parks Gift Shop Grant Program, which allocates the proceeds from its Gift Shop sales to educational and interpretive programs in Nevada's State Parks. Park fees may be assessed for boating, camping, or other specific fees including special programs or tours. The pass does not include federal, regional, or other public lands in Nevada that are not part the Nevada State Park system.




Celebrating International Women's Day
