## Mine Rescue Team Brings Home Trophies

## 2022 Elko Safety Olympiad

The 2022 Elko Safety Olympiad was recently held in Elko on September 27-29. This is the one time per year where emergency response teams from Nevada and neighboring states gather to practice their response skills in a friendly competition over three days.

Team Captain John Burton couldn't be prouder. He and his team work year-round to train and practice for emergency situations. The trophies earned at the Olympiad are just the icing on the cake. "It's nice to be able to go out of town and not have to worry, as I know the mine is in good hands with a top notch team of responders," said John.

This top notch team showed off their skills in seven areas during the Olympiad. In the medical event, the team placed third. In the scenario, there was a head-on collision involving four patients in two small sedans. One of the patients was pregnant, whereby Jonathan got to "deliver" the baby. In the triage sce-

nario, the team placed first. This scenario was a T-bone collision between two vans with a total of 13 patients who had to be sorted out by level of injuries. The fire scenario was a structure fire with one victim needing rescued, before accessing the structure, a propane tank caught on fire and had to first be extinguished. A written exam is also given over all aspects of the mine rescue competition. The confined space scenario was two employees working in a confined space performing repairs. The team had to ensure scene safety in order to access the patients to rescue. In the hazmat scenario an acid offload was leaking. There was a patient inside the vehicle unconscious. The team had to stop the leak from the tanker and evacuate the patient. The team placed second in the ropes scenario. In this scenario, an employee who was doing maintenance work on a tower had fallen and was suspended from his harness. The team used two rescuers, Jonathan Olsen and Atrayu Pickering, to access and establish a high angle change of direction,





tie a new harness on him, remove him from his line and then lowered him to the ground with one of the rescuers.

Members of the Round Mountain Emergency Response Team are a mix of veteran rescuers and eager new team members. Led by Captain John Burton and Co-Captain/Utility Atrayu Pickering, the team performed well overall. "We don't do this just to bring home trophies," says Atrayu. "We do this to become better medics, rescuers, and firefighters. The greatest benefit to this competition is the ability we have to take what we learn and raise up all of our fellow responders," he continued. Other team members are Allen Stumpf, Main Line Rigger; Caleb Horner, Belay Line Rigger; Jonathan Olsen, Lead Medic; Kurt Albo, Medic; RJ Jones, Utility; Kenna Burton, Alternate; and Team Trainer Sergio Olmedo.

John concluded by saying, "We have some little things to tighten up on as far as competition goes, but I must say that I am very proud of the team as a whole. I would like to thank RMGC's management team and all of the departments for working with us year round for our responses, trainings, and going up to competition. Without their continued support, our team would not be where it is at today."




