Recruiting at Nevada STEM Fair

Getting the word out to young science and math professionals that Kinross Round Mountain and Kinross Bald Mountain are seeking employees in these hard-to-fill areas is an important mission. Since 2020, it's been difficult reaching prospective employees in the areas of engineering, geology, and hydrology, said Haley. Virtual career fairs weren't as successful as face-to-face meetings. But now things are looking up as the recruiting team heads out to visit different career fairs and events.

According to Haley, dozens of students stopped at their table to learn about job opportunities at Kinross. "We received about 40 resumes from students interested in summer internships and careers at Kinross," said Haley, calling the event very successful.

Haley also mentioned that Kinross Nevada is putting a lot of effort into recruiting not only at universities, but also trade schools. There is a recruiting trip planned for Idaho State University at the end of October to speak with both trade students and science and math students at a STEM fair there. "It is important for us to build relationships between institutions like University of Nevada, Reno and Idaho State University to build a pipeline of talent to our mines," said Haley.

Trade schools, like the one at ISU, prepare students in the trades like welding, electrician, and diesel technician, whereas universities like Nevada prepare engineers, geologists and hydrologists. Historically, all of these positions have been hard to fill. Keeping a strong relationship with the schools that train for these positions is important for the future of Kinross Round Mountain and Kinross Bald Mountain.


