



A Taste of History

The Round Mountain Elementary School built in 1936 houses the Sunnyside Museum. It was a first through twelfth grade two classroom school. During the booms and busts of mining in the area there were two teachers responsible for the task of covering the span of learning abilities.

The school was in use until the mid-nineteen nineties along with some of the modular buildings used by the current elementary school.

Karl W. Berg, a second generation Berg in Smoky Valley, had the vision of relocating the building, and transforming it into a museum. With the help of Round Mountain Gold, that dream became a reality. The building was moved to its current location and the Sunnyside Historical Society was formed.

The Sunnyside Museum has various displays of mining equipment, tools, ranching equipment, every day household items, and early American artifacts. Most of the items have been collected from the Berg family whose rich history in the valley is captured. Donations from others have been greatly appreciated and the goal of representing Smoky Valley and Central Nevada.
