With 15 seconds left in the match, his opponent took Treygan down for a 3-1 lead. Treygan didn't give up and scored a reversal with 5 seconds left to tie the match 3-3. The reversal took Treygan's opponent directly to his back, where Treygan earned another 4 points for near fall, giving Treygan the 7-3 win as time expired.

Rory Diller went 1-2 in his 10U 56lb. Varsity division, where he pinned an opponent who he had lost two twice this season.




Blast from the Past: Nevada History



Manhattan, Nevada

The Manhattan district was active long before the town of Manhattan was formed. The initial discovery of silver ore was in 1866 and by 1869 things was slowing down. Before the year was over the district was totally abandoned. Manhattan district remained silent until major new discoveries were made in 1905. The town sprang up almost over night when four cowpunchers traveling from Belmont through Manhattan Gulch discovered ore that assayed as much as \$3,000 a ton. Initially, a tent city of 500 formed at the mouth of Manhattan Gulch. Prospectors discovered a new ledge that assayed as high as \$10,000 a ton, focusing even more interest on Manhattan. Soon, the gulch was filled with saloons, hotels, assay offices, and few schools. A post office was opened in December of 1905. By that time, the town had three banks, a Wells Fargo office, seventy-five frame buildings, and a population of 1,000. It also had three newspapers. And then came the San Francisco earthquake of April 1906 that shook Manhattan as much as it did San Francisco. San Francisco financiers who withdrew their support to rebuild San Francisco backed much of the mining activity in Manhattan. Manhattan's banks closed and the population dropped to a few hundred. Despite this setback, many businesses remained open and continued to operate. New discoveries in September 1906 and June of 1907 barely kept the town alive. The town's perseverance paid off when, in 1909, rich placer deposits were discovered on the edge of Big Smoky Valley, a few miles below Manhattan. During Manhattan's lengthy production period many different mining companies were active in the district and the total value of ore mined in the district is well over \$12 million.

Patriots Program


The Town of Round Mountain would like to honor our veterans, past and present. A project is underway to gather information, design and display our veterans. All at no cost for you!



Exciting News! Manhattan Library and Museum will be opening again soon for the summer!

The Manhattan School in Manhattan, Nevada, is a historic schoolhouse opened in 1913 to accommodate the growing student population in the community following a gold rush. Featuring a vernacular design with unique patterned metal plates both inside and out, the school closed in 1955 due to declining population but was later repurposed as a library, museum, and community center.

Recognized for its historical significance, the Manhattan School was added to the National Register of Historic Places in 2004. The school's restoration and transformation into a multifunctional space by the Smoky Valley Library District have preserved its legacy as a symbol of the town's resilience and adaptation over the years.

Manhattan Public Library and the museum will be opening again for visitors Thursday April 10, 2025. Hours will be Thursdays from 1:00 pm - 5:00 pm, Fridays from 1:00 pm - 5:00 pm, and hours will vary on Saturdays. Be sure to stop in to learn about some local history! Also be on the look out for programs, ghost hunts, and more!!




